The bulk of the meeting was dedicated to the progress of the Value-added Agriculture Project.


Some deliverables were met including identifying key industries where there was a potential for investor interest. These being meat processing, pet food and animal feed, and functional foods.

Grant deadline around the corner

Whether your community is planning ways to increase tourism in your area, develop a study for building small business incubators or looking do a strategic study on developing new revenue streams, make sure to check out the Alberta government's Community and Regional Economic Support (CARES) program.

The program offers matching grants for economic development initiatives to municipalities, not for profits, First Nations and Metis Settlements – each with their own matching percentage requirements.

The current intake of applications **ends June 30**. However, there are three more opportunities to apply for this grant:

- Oct. 1 to Oct. 31, 2018
- May 1 to May 31, 2019
- Oct. 1 to Oct. 31, 2019
- *All dates are inclusive.

Another great funding opportunity offered by the government is its <u>Small</u> <u>Business Resources</u>, where you will find information on funding, regulations and other important information.
