


# Living in Beaver County




## Living in Beaver County



### Healthcare

The Tofield Health Centre and the Viking Health Centre are both located in Beaver County and offer services in emergency, acute, continuing and palliative care, surgery, obstetrics, rehabilitation, respiratory therapy, X-Ray, mammography and more. In addition, numerous healthcare services throughout the County include medical clinics, chiropractors, dentists, optometrists, physical therapy providers and senior living facilities that ensure the community's healthcare needs are met.



### Education

Beaver County is part of the Battle River School Division #31, which is headquartered in Wainwright. Schools include C.W. Sears (K-4) and Tofield School (5-12) in Tofield, Viking School (K-12). Beaver County is only a 30 minute drive to institutions in Edmonton such as NAIT, University of Alberta, and Grant MacEwan University. The Beaver County Community Adult Learning Council (CALC) is committed to supporting and promoting lifelong learning to enrich peoples' lives in our communities by providing an assortment of adult-learning opportunities. Continuing education services are available through Wainwright Adult Learning.


