




# Living in Flagstaff County



## ABOUT FLAGSTAFF COUNTY

Flagstaff County has become known as the “Community of communities”. Ten urban communities located within Flagstaff County work hard for the betterment of the area through regional collaboration. We offer affordable cost of living, exciting recreational opportunities, friendly people and an enjoyable rural lifestyle. Flagstaff County has an extremely rich and diverse landscape, which is characterized by gently undulating topography through the majority of the municipality. The Battle River borders the southern portion of the municipality, meandering its way through the tall hills of the region.

The economy of Flagstaff County thrives on its agricultural base and the oil and gas activity in the area. A distinct advantage is the proximity of the “Hardisty Hub”, the central pipeline hub where the majority of Alberta’s oil production converges for transportation to North American energy markets.



Flagstaff County is located in the Battle River Alliance for Economic Development (BRAED) region. BRAED is a partnership of communities in East Central Alberta that work cooperatively to address economic development issues from a regional perspective.






## Living in Flagstaff County



### Healthcare

There are three primary health centres in Flagstaff County including: the Daysland Health Centre offering services in 24-hour emergency, acute care, obstetrics, surgery, respite care, palliative care, and rehabilitation; The Hardisty Health Centre with services in acute and continuing care, 24-hour emergency, and X-Ray; and, the Killam Health Care Centre, an acute care and continuing care facility providing 24-hour emergency, diagnostic, therapeutic and community health.

Flagstaff County's urban municipalities also offer mental health, family services, rehab, physiotherapy, massage therapy, chiropractors, optometrist and dental services.



### Education

The Battle River Regional School Division #31 serves Flagstaff County. School are located within Daysland (K-12), Forestburg (K-12), Killam (K-9), and Sedgewick (1-12). Flagstaff is also home to a Community Adult Learning Center located in Killam that offers short courses and job skills. Flagstaff County is close to the Augustana Campus of the University of Alberta located in Camrose and the Lakeland College Campus located in Vermilion.
