
# Living in Village of Holden

The Village of Holden is conveniently located a short 55 minute drive southeast of Edmonton and a 45 minute drive northeast of Camrose. Access to Vegreville and the TransCanada Highway is just 25 minutes to the north. This provides Holden the ability to offer its residents easy access to large city amenities, while still allowing them to enjoy a peaceful, safe and relaxing small-town lifestyle.

Holden is situated on fairly flat land with wide streets, sidewalks and some paved roads. Homes are well kept and numerous new homes have been built recently due to our robust economy. 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


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### Healthcare

There are two hospitals within 40 kilometres of Holden in the towns of Viking and Tofield. The Tofield Health Centre features active treatment and long-term care facilities supported by a professional staff of 140. The Centre offers services in emergency, acute care, continuing care, palliative care, occupational therapy, X-Ray and more. The Viking Health Centre offers services in emergency, acute, continuing and palliative care, surgery, obstetrics, rehabilitation, respiratory therapy, X-Ray, mammography and more. Other health services available include home care, rehabilitation, health promotion, dental and eye care, and alternative therapies. Mental health, family services, rehab, massage therapy, chiropractors, eye care and other services are also available in Tofield and the surrounding region.



### Education

Students attend Ryley School for grades K-12. Holden is only an hour drive from institutions in Edmonton such as NAIT, University of Alberta, and Grant MacEwan University. The Beaver County Community Adult Learning Council (CALC) is committed to supporting and promoting lifelong learning to enrich peoples' lives in our communities by providing an assortment of adult-learning opportunities. Continuing education services are also available through Wainwright Adult Learning.

### Community Services

Amenities located within the Village of Holden include grocery stores, accommodations, restaurants, banking, postal services, insurance services, convenience stores, a laundromat and so much more.

Local emergency services include:

- Holden is served by a Volunteer Fire Department, which is part of the Beaver Emergency Services Commission. This organization also provides emergency management for the region.
- The Village is served by the Tofield/Viking Detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.
- Holden is served by Beaver Ambulance, a federally registered charitable society, providing service in all of Beaver County, including Tofield, Ryley, Holden, and Viking.



### Recreation

Recreation facilities include the Holden Complex arena and show ring, three ball diamonds, a performing arts theatre, art gallery, playground, and spray park.

Local community organizations include the Agricultural Society, Royal Canadian Legion, Municipal Library Board, Masonic Lodge, Historical Society, Minor Hockey Association, Senior's Club, Holden Parent Nursery, Beaver Regional Arts Society, Beaverhill Players, Holden Economic Development Committee, Holden Community Hall Association, HEARTS, Beaverhill Players and the Studio 14 Art Association.
