



CanExport Deadline is October 16

The CanExport Community Investments program is accepting applications from Canadian communities seeking financial support for their foreign direct investment (FDI) initiatives for the year 2020.

This includes support for research and other strategic planning expenses to help communities begin the process in a meaningful way.

Western Economic Development announced new funding of \$3,633,417 through the Canada Coal Transition

through the Canada Coal Transition
Initiative (CCTI) for two communities and
one labour organization in Alberta.

Hanna Learning Centre (HLC) will receive \$693,500 to establish a business hub and concierge centre for business inquiries and entrepreneurship support.

The County of Paintearth No. 18 will receive \$2,739,917 to support business ecosystem development and hire transition staff in east-central Alberta.

United Steel Workers ASM #1595 will receive \$200,000 to hire a transition coordinator in Wabamun, AB to support laid-off coal industry workers.

Edgerton Storage Facility Now Open

The Village of Edgerton recently opened their Edgerton Storage Facility to the public. The Facility is fully fenced, with locking gates, a groomed surface, solar lights, twenty four hour access, and surveillance cameras.

The Village hopes that residents and other interested parties take advantage of the Facility to store vehicles, containers, trailers and other property. Currently, a 10' wide space is being offered for \$30.00/month or \$150.00/six months.
