
Living in The Town of Hardisty



ABOUT THE TOWN OF HARDISTY

Hardisty is located in Flagstaff County, 111 kilometres from the Saskatchewan border, near the crossroads of Highway 13 and Highway 881 in the Battle River Valley. We are in the center of a hunter's paradise, with upland game, ducks, geese, mule and whitetail deer. Hardisty Lake, which is in the town limits, attracts many tourists from near and far. Our continued development and growth for the community includes working towards revitalizing the town as an attractive urban centre for living and working.

Hardisty's major industry is oil and gas with the town being mainly known as a pivotal petroleum industry hub where petroleum products such as Western Canada Select blended crude oil and Hardisty heavy oil are produced and traded. In addition, Hardisty is surrounded by a good agricultural area for mixed farming of cattle and various types of grain.



Hardisty is located in the Battle River Alliance for Economic Development (BRAED) region. BRAED is a partnership of communities in East Central Alberta that work cooperatively to address economic development issues from a regional perspective.



Healthcare

The Hardisty Health Centre offers services in acute and continuing care, 24-hour emergency, and X-Ray. The Centre has five acute care beds, 14 long-term care beds and a respite bed. Hardisty also has a medical clinic, drug store, home care services, as well as a centre for mental health and counseling. Health unit and home care services are based out of the Sedgewick Health Unit. Regional municipalities also offer mental health, family services, rehab, massage therapy, chiropractors and optometry.



Education

Hardisty is served by the The Battle River Regional School Division #31, headquartered in Camrose. Allan Johnstone School offers a full range of educational programming for Kindergarten to Grade 9 students living in the town of Hardisty and surrounding rural areas. High School grades (10-12) are taught at Central High Sedgewick Public School. In addition to the regular academic program, numerous extra-curricular opportunities exist, and we encourage all students to participate fully in their grade school experience to make these years as rewarding and enjoyable as possible. Hardisty is close to the Augustana Campus of the University of Alberta, located in Camrose. In addition, the Battle River School Training Foundation is a not-for-profit foundation providing college credit courses to rural Albertans within Flagstaff County and the Battle for Economic Development.

Community Services

Hardisty offers a wide variety of services, organizations and clubs that help to support, strengthen and bring our community together. Recreation

Hardisty Lake is our own recreational paradise. The lake includes a sandy beach, camping facilities, a nine-hole grass-green golf course, three ball diamonds and stampede grounds.

Hardisty also has a large recreation centre, consisting of a regulation sized arena, and a three-sheet curling rink. In the winter, there are miles of cross-country ski trails through the lake park and along the banks of the Battle River. For the sportsman, upland game, geese, ducks, mule and whitetail deer are plentiful. Hunters from miles around come to the district.
